# Hobbits, wizards, goblins, and adventure in "The Hobbit" at Pittsburgh Public Theater All-ages adventure to feature large-scale puppetry from The Public's Resident Artists

**Sept. 24, 2024** | The O'Reilly Theater will host dragons, goblins, elves, and more fantastical creatures in Pittsburgh Public Theater's upcoming puppet-driven all-ages fantasy adventure "The Hobbit," on stage Oct. 23–Nov. 10 and presented by the M. Patrick Daniels Fund of The Pittsburgh Foundation. The Public today announced the full cast and crew, featuring a renowned puppetry team and a Pittsburgh Public Theater debut from **Russell Saylor** ("Dora's the Explorer Live!" national tour) as leading adventurer Bilbo Baggins.

"Harnessing the imagination and creativity of young people and bringing them into the theater to share in a live performance is rocket fuel for the art form and ensures that the theater will be embraced and propelled by a new generation of artists and theater lovers," Saylor said. "The Hobbit' is one of those timeless, universal adventure stories that inspires families of all ages to participate in live theater."

Pittsburgh Public Theater Artistic Director **Marya Sea Kaminski** directs this adaptation of the fabled tale from **Greg Banks** (Public Unplugged's "Robin Hood"), <u>described</u> as "a triumph of storytelling," and will lead the seven-member cast and renowned design team, including The Public's Resident Artists **Jamie Agnello** and **Matt Acheson**. The pair will serve as co-creators and co-designers of the production's elaborate puppet designs, which will bring the story's incredible characters to vivid life on the O'Reilly Theater stage, while Agnello plays in the cast and Acheson serves as puppet director.

"Live music and extraordinary puppets transform Bilbo's living room into the forests of Mirkwood and the cliffs of the Lonely Mountain, as Tolkien's monsters and heroes manifest and disappear right in front of our eyes," Kaminski said. "This story dares us to believe that a wild imagination and true, tender friendship can make magic possible even in the gravest circumstances."

*Dungeons & Dragons* meets *Jumanji* in this visionary telling of "The Hobbit" as a tabletop game between friends quickly escalates into a collective fever dream, leading the group to overcome obstacles ranging from monstrous goblins to fearsome dragons and form a bond for the ages.

Saylor's homebody Bilbo Baggins is joined by a merry band of travelers including: **Shammen McCune** as Gandalf; **Ryan Patrick Kearney** as Thorin Oakenshield; **José Pérez IV** as Bombur and Elven Queen; **Britt Dorazio** as a Fili and Bard; and **Jamie Agnello** as Balin and Gollum. On their journeys they face troubles small and large, including **Maya B. Fullard** as the dragon Smaug (also appearing as Kili).

Scenic Designer Jennifer Zeyl joins Costume Designer Melanie Taylor Burgess, Lighting Designer Robert J. Aguilar, Sound Designer Zach Moore, and Composer Stewart Blackwood to transform The O'Reilly into Middle Earth. Completing the creative team behind The Public's staging of "The Hobbit" are Dramaturg Lindsay L. Barr, Assistant Directors Dominique Briggs and Oy Adebajo, Stage Manager Lisa R. Stafford, Assistant Stage Manager Kelly Haywood, Production Assistant Gabriella Walko, and Fight Director José Pérez IV.

The Public also offers more ways to join the fun with special events at Pittsburgh Public Theater. Pair your show ticket with a wine tasting through Wine Wednesdays on Wednesday, Oct. 23, or come kick

### Marya Sea Kaminski

### Director

Marya Sea Kaminski is honored to co-lead Pittsburgh Public Theater. She came to Pittsburgh after four years as the Associate Artistic Director at Seattle Repertory Theatre. One of the highlights of her tenure there was spearheading a collaboration with New York's Public Theater and Dallas Theatre Center to create Public Works Seattle. This initiative was based on long-term, authentic partnerships between regional theaters and local non-profits and designed to make theater of, by, and for the people. Earlier in her career, Marya co-founded the Washington Ensemble Theatre and served as Co-Artistic Director there for five years, leading season planning and new play development. She has worked as a director, writer, producer and actor and is a proud member of the Stage Directors and Choreographers Society, Actors' Equity Association, and the Society of Authors and Dramatic Composers. Marya has taught and lectured on Theater at Hollins University, the University of Washington, and at Cornish College of the Arts, where she was awarded the Drama Department's Award for Teaching Excellence. She has also been honored with the Genius Award in Theater from the Seattle newsweekly, The Stranger, and has been recognized as an Artist of the Year by Seattle Magazine. Marya holds a BA in English and Theatre Arts from the University of Pennsylvania and an MFA from the University of Washington's School of Drama.

### **Greg Banks**

### Adaptation writer

Greg has established an international reputation in his work for young audiences of all ages. In 2024 as a nationally acclaimed playwright in the USA he was awarded the Charlotte B Chorpenning Award for his outstanding body of work for young people. His plays take the realities of life and the harshness of our classic stories and render an epic work that speaks directly to, not at, young people. He trusts young audiences to grasp big emotions and ideas. His plays are works of transformation and grand adventure. His scripts have a fluid muscularity, a rhythm that is echoed in the strongly physical nature of his direction. Music is an essential component. A close collaboration with composers and on-stage musicians to create a live and original score ensures that the music is fully integrated into the work, driving the story forward, evoking place and emotion in a very specific way.



It is important that the audience is not just a passive observer, that they are acknowledged by the actors and that the story being told is shared by everyone in the room. Greg is currently a guest director at The Minneapolis Children's Theatre where he has been commissioned to write and direct many adaptations of well-known classics including *Huck Finn, Antigone, The Hobbit, Snow White, Pinocchio, The Jungle Book,* and *Robin Hood.* He has also directed *Romeo and Juliet,* Wrinkle In Time, Charlotte's Web and Sleeping Beauty for the Children's Theatre. Other productions he has written and directed include Tir Na N'og for Travelling Light Theatre \*\*\*\* (Guardian), Nominated TMA Award. 'Why The Whales Came' an adaptation of a Jim Sheridans film 'Into The west' for The Plymouth Theatre Royal and Theatre Alibi \*\*\*\* (Guardian) Nominated TMA Award.

Greg has written over thirty original scripts many of which are currently being produced at Theatres and other venues throughout The States and Canada. Some are also available through 'Plays for Young Audiences.'
