Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra Returns to Carnegie Hall in December 2025

PITTSBURGH, PA—The **Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra (PSO)** will return to **Carnegie Hall** on **December 3, 2025**, under the direction of **Music Director Manfred Honeck**. This highly anticipated performance will be part of the **orchestra's 2025–2026 season**, the full details of which will be announced on **February 18, 2025**.

The PSO's Carnegie Hall program will feature a New York premiere and two orchestral masterworks:

- LERA AUERBACH: Frozen Dreams (New York Premiere) + PSO Commission
- RACHMANINOFF: Rhapsody on a Theme of Paganini (featuring pianist Seong-Jin Cho)
- SHOSTAKOVICH: Symphony No. 5

The PSO is especially proud to present Shostakovich's *Symphony No. 5* which was on their GRAMMY[®] Award-winning recording for Best Orchestral Performance in 2018. Prior to the Carnegie Hall concert, the program will be performed in **Pittsburgh at Heinz Hall on December 2, 2025**, offering local audiences the opportunity to experience this significant event.

A Legacy of Excellence on the World Stage

PSO's return to Carnegie Hall continues a **storied history** that dates back to 1900, when **Andrew Carnegie personally funded the orchestra's first performance on the Hall's legendary stage under the direction of Victor Herbert**. The orchestra made frequent return visits in the early 20th century, and from 1992 to 2006, under Lorin Maazel and Mariss Jansons, the PSO was a near-annual presence at Carnegie Hall. This performance marks **Manfred Honeck's third appearance at Carnegie Hall with the PSO**, following acclaimed performances in 2010 with violinist Anne-Sophie Mutter and 2014 with **Mozart's Requiem**.

A Cultural Ambassador for Pittsburgh

The Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra has long been recognized as a **cultural ambassador for Pittsburgh and one of America's leading orchestras**, bringing **transformative musical experiences** to audiences worldwide. The return to Carnegie Hall underscores PSO's **commitment to artistic excellence, innovation, and global reach**.
