

Gates of East & West

Classroom Discussion Activity

During the early 1900s, the United States had a major immigration station on its east and west coasts: Ellis Island in New York City and Angel Island in San Francisco Bay. These two ports of entry had many similarities as well as significant differences. Use this activity with students to learn more about the history of Ellis & Angel Islands.

Step 1: Research

Have students review the following recommended resources about the history of Angel Island and Ellis Island, either as individual homework or together in class. Remind students to take notes as they review each resource:

- Compare what you know about Angel Island and Ellis Island. What similarities do you notice? What is different? Why do you think those differences existed?
- What else do you want to know about the immigration process? What is the first step you will take to find out?
