Folclórico— Spanish for “folkloric”; based on or resembling folklore

Instrumentalist – someone who plays a musical instrument

South America – a continent in the southwestern hemisphere

Spanish – a language spoken in many countries including Spain, much of Central and South America, and elsewhere worldwide

Vocalist – someone who sings
